**BELL NAMES & STATISTICS**

Each bell is named after one of the parish churches in the Deanery of St. James' which approximates the area of the old town of York. It connects their name, "The Bells of Old York" in its secular sense with the message of the bells and the relationship of the Cathedral to the other parishes. The bells will ring on events of state such as recently celebrating the passing into international law of the Ottawa Treaty for the banning of land-mines. They will ring for the church as the "church's loud voice" to proclaim our salvation through Christ to all who may not enter through our doors.
