Someone asked Honourable Justice Murray Sinclair: Why can't Indigenous peoples just "get over" residential schools and colonization? Justice Sinclair responded:

"My answer has always been: Why can't you always remember this? Because this is about memorializing those people who have been the victims of a great wrong. Why don't you tell the United States to 'get over' 9/11? Why don't you tell this country to 'get over' all the veterans who died in the Second World War, instead of honouring them once a year?

Why don't you tell your families to stop thinking about all of your ancestors who died?... It's because it's important for us to remember. We learn from it. And until people show that they have learned from this, we will never forget, and we should never forget, even once they have learned from it, because this is part of who we are. It's not just a part of who we are as survivors and children of survivors and relatives of survivors, it's part of who we are as a nation. And this nation must never forget what it once did to its most vulnerable people."



## **Welcome to St. James Cathedral**

*This sacred land is the territory of several Indigenous Nations - the Wendat, the Haudenosaunee, and the Anishnaabe, with special recognition to the Mississaugas of New Credit. We also acknowledge that we are on the shores of Niigaani-gichigami/Lake Ontario. This territory is governed by the Dish With One Spoon Wampum Belt Treaty, an agreement between the Haudenosaunee Confederacy and the Anishnaabe Confederacy to peaceably share and sustain the life of the Great Lakes. In the spirit of that Treaty we seek to place at the centre of our gatherings the values of respectful reciprocity, diversity, peace, responsibility, and mutual aid.*

### **First Lesson**

*Reader*

The judges also, with their respective names, whose hearts did not fall into idolatry and who did not turn away from the Lord—may their memory be blessed! May their bones send forth new life from where they lie, and may the names of those who have been honoured live again in their children! Samuel was beloved by his Lord; a prophet of the Lord, he established the kingdom and anointed rulers over his people. By the law of the Lord he judged the congregation, and the Lord watched over Jacob. By his faithfulness he was proved to be a prophet, and by his words he became known as a trustworthy seer. He called upon the Lord, the Mighty One, when his enemies pressed him on every side, and he offered in sacrifice a sucking-lamb. Then the Lord thundered from heaven, and made his voice heard with a mighty sound; he subdued the leaders of the enemy and all the rulers of the Philistines. Before the time of his eternal sleep, Samuel bore witness before the Lord and his anointed: ‘No property, not so much as a pair of shoes, have I taken from anyone!’ And no one accused him. Even after he had fallen asleep, he prophesied and made known to the king his death, and lifted up his voice from the ground in prophecy, to blot out the wickedness of the people.

**Second Lesson***Please be seated.**Luke 12: 41-48**Reader*

Peter said, ‘Lord, are you telling this parable for us or for everyone?’  
And the Lord said, ‘Who then is the faithful and prudent manager  
whom his master will put in charge of his slaves, to give them their  
allowance of food at the proper time? Blessed is that slave whom his  
master will find at work when he arrives. Truly I tell you, he will put  
that one in charge of all his possessions. But if that slave says to  
himself, “My master is delayed in coming”, and if he begins to beat  
the other slaves, men and women, and to eat and drink and get drunk,  
the master of that slave will come on a day when he does not expect  
him and at an hour that he does not know, and will cut him in pieces,  
and put him with the unfaithful. That slave who knew what his  
master wanted, but did not prepare himself or do what was wanted,  
will receive a severe beating. But one who did not know and did what  
deserved a beating will receive a light beating. From everyone to  
whom much has been given, much will be required; and from one to  
whom much has been entrusted, even more will be demanded.
