Music Note

This Sunday we are privileged to share the compositions of four living composers. The Evensong responses by our own Philippa Campsie were written for the first female vicar of the Cathedral, Canon Dr. Judy Rois. These are paired with a meditative setting of the Canticles by former Cathedral Director of Music, Matthew Larkin, who currently serves the Parish of St. Thomas's Huron Street. The introit is by Guy Turner, a jazz-influenced motet to words by former Dean of Durham Cathedral, Peter Baelz: "... in the making of music, you have given us a delight for the mind, and a solace for the heart. By the harmonies of your grace, resolve the discord of our own lives." Our 11am Mass setting is by Derek Holman, who served both the churches of Grace on-the-hill (1965-1979) and St. Simon the Apostle (1980-1998). We hope that you will consider joining us on Tuesdays at 1:00pm to support some of the city's finest talents, giving organ recitals every week of the year. Entry is free, and donations are always gratefully accepted. Next week at 11:00am (December 16) the upper voices of the Cathedral Choir will sing Benjamin Britten's timeless setting of the Missa Brevis in D, written for the choristers of Westminster Cathedral.
