This sacred land is the territory of several Indigenous Nations - the Wendat, the Haudenosaunee, and the Anishnaabe, with special recognition to the Mississaugas of New Credit. Psalm 81

Choir

O sing merrily unto God our strength; make a cheerful noise unto the God of Jacob. Raise the psalm and sound the timbrel. the merry harp with the lute. Blow up the trumpet in the new moon, at the full moon, for our solemn feast day. For this was made a statute for Israel. and a law of the God of Jacob. This he ordained in Joseph for a testimony, when he went forth against the land of Egypt. I heard the voice of one that I knew not: 'I eased his shoulder from the burden. and his hands were freed from the load. Thou didst call in trouble, and I delivered thee; I heard thee in the thunder-cloud; I proved thee also at the Waters of Strife. Hear, O my people, and I will testify unto thee: O Israel, if thou wouldest hearken unto me! There shall no strange god be in thee, neither shalt thou worship any other god. I am the LORD thy God, who brought thee out of the land of Egypt: open thy mouth wide, and I will fill it. But my people would not hear my voice; and Israel would not obey me. So I gave them up unto their stubborn hearts, and let them follow their own imaginations. O that my people would hearken unto me, that Israel would walk in my ways! I should soon put down their enemies, and turn my hand against their adversaries. The haters of the LORD should feign obedience unto him; but their time should endure for ever. First Lesson

Proverbs 1: 20-33

- Reader Wisdom cries out in the street; in the squares she raises her voice. At the busiest corner she cries out; at the entrance of the city gates she speaks: 'How long, O simple ones, will you love being simple? How long will scoffers delight in their scoffing and fools hate knowledge? Give heed to my reproof; I will pour out my thoughts to you; I will make my words known to you. Because I have called and you refused, have stretched out my hand and no one heeded, and because you have ignored all my counsel and would have none of my reproof, I also will laugh at your calamity; I will mock when panic strikes you, when panic strikes you like a storm, and your calamity comes like a whirlwind, when distress and anguish come upon you. Then they will call upon me, but I will not answer; they will seek me diligently, but will not find me. Because they hated knowledge and did not choose the fear of the Lord, would have none of my counsel, and despised all my reproof, therefore they shall eat the fruit of their way and be sated with their own devices. For waywardness kills the simple, and the complacency of fools destroys them; but those who listen to me will be secure and will live at ease, without dread of disaster.'

'I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep. The hired hand, who is not the shepherd and does not own the sheep, sees the wolf coming and leaves the sheep and runs away—and the wolf snatches them and scatters them. The hired hand runs away because a hired hand does not care for the sheep. I am the good shepherd. I know my own and my own know me, just as the Father knows me and I know the Father. And I lay down my life for the sheep. I have other sheep that do not belong to this fold. I must bring them also, and they will listen to my voice. So there will be one flock, one shepherd.




