On Friday March 1, 2019 walking into the Cathedral to prepare for a memorial service, I was met by Adam, one of our community tour guides who alerted me to an act of vandalism done to one of the welcome banners that hang on the outside of the Cathedral. We immediately removed that portion of the banner.

The World Pride welcome, now uncovered, reminds us of our history as an affirming and welcoming Christian community, and that these banners are 5 years old. We are in the process of trying to repair the damaged banner, or replace it. Both full banners are in need of replacement, as they are weather worn and faded. MUSIC

Music Note

We know very little about Cipriano de Rore (c.1515 - 1565) and cannot be sure about where or when he was born or where he received his training. By the time he reached his late twenties, we know that he was a singer at St. Mark's in Venice under the direction of Adrian Willaert. He went on to become the choirmaster at the court of Ferrara when the Duke was Hercules II d'Este in 1546. This particular Duke was a great patron of the arts and of the chapel's music. Cipriano dedicates his mass 'Praeter Rerum Seriem', 'This is no normal scheme', to his boss by including a cantus firmus in an extra tenor part which reads: "Hercules secundus, dux Ferrariae quartus vivit et vivet ('Hercules II, fourth Duke of Ferrara lives and will live'). This hidden message is almost indecipherable among the ornate cascading lines of the Holy Holy Holy and Agnus Dei. At our 4:30pm Evensong the choir will offer a 16th Century pastiche by our Director of Music as the introit, built using similar techniques. The anthem text is taken from the Song of Songs and set to music by William Walton. This sumptuous a cappella piece reaches its climax at the words 'for love is strong as death' after the opening tenor solo "Set me as a seal upon thine heart'. Please do mark your calendars as we welcome the choir of Grace Church on-the-Hill as they come to sing Choral Evensong on Sunday, March 24 at 4:30pm.
