On Tuesday, May 21 at 1:00pm, our Parish Choir alto, Mekhriban Mamedova, will be giving a recital of piano music - join us for a pay-what-you-can concert over your lunch break to hear Mozart's famous Rondo alla Turk and Piano Sonata 11 in A major. We have a sherry and snacks reception following Choral Evensong on May 26 at 4:30pm. As we welcome the Oxford and Cambridge Society of Toronto to that service, the choir will offer music by composers associated with those universities, from Howells and Leighton to Sheppard and Weir (the current Master of the Queen's Music). This week at Choral Evensong the Cathedral Choir will be singing an exulting anthem by William Byrd, calling out for justice and an abundance of peace in *Laetentur Coeli*. Psalm 136 tends to put a smile on the faces of choirs as they attempt to sing 'For His mercy endureth forever' in as many different ways as possible, while speaking of the mysterious Og, the King of Bashan and Sihon, King of the Amorites. SPRING SHOPPING LIST

Six Speakers to Enhance the Cathedral's Sound System

Over the past few months, we have become increasingly aware of the limitations of the sound system in the cathedral. Parishioners and visitors alike are finding it very difficult to hear the officiant or homilist during services. We have a solution, **but we need your help.**

For major services, such as Christmas and Easter, our property department rents six speakers, stands and cables to bring the sound system up to acceptable levels. This has created a remarkable difference in sound quality, and parishioners comment how much clearer they can hear the liturgy and homily. **Did you know that it costs approximately \$800 to rent the speakers and equipment each time?**

Our desire is to enhance the sound for you 52 Sundays of the year – not just on special services. **The following is the quote we have received to purchase the speakers and equipment:**

6x QSC K10.2 Speakers:	\$6000.
6 K&M Speaker Stands:	900.
Cable:	300.
<u>Installation & PA tuning:</u>	<u>500.</u>
Grand Total:	\$7700 + HST

Unfortunately, our budget does not have room for this expense. So, we are calling on the cathedral community to assist us. **If you feel moved to help improve the sound quality in the cathedral permanently, we hope you will consider donating.** Any donation amount will be greatly appreciated.

To donate, you can send in a donation by mail to the Cathedral office, or you can place it on the offertory in a designated envelope at worship. You are also welcome to make a donation online at stjamescathedral.ca/donate (click on “speaker system” at the lefthand side of the screen.) Any donation over \$20 is tax receipted.

Money raised over the cost of the speakers and equipment will go towards purchasing additional fans for the Nave and Chancel.
