## MUSIC NOTE

The Choir of St. James Cathedral sings Choral Evensong every Sunday at 4:30pm as part of a quintessentially Anglican cycle of prayer which has been offered here for at least 200 years, and across the world for around 500 years. This living tradition has been stable and fertile ground for musical excellence and evolution. A great deal of music for this service has come from the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge in the UK, whose Alumni groups we welcome as guests today. The service begins with a short introit by John Sheppard who served as the Informator Choristarum at Magdalen College Oxford in the 1540s. Bernard Rose's famous set of responses was also composed for that institution, after his undergraduate degree at St. Catharine's College, Cambridge in 1935. The resplendent Collegium Regale Magnificat was composed by Herbert Howells during World War Two, when he was acting Organist at St. John's College, Cambridge. Kenneth Leighton was a student at the Queen's College, Oxford, before writing his majestic Nunc Dimittis for Magdalen, just down the High Street in 1960. Judith Weir CBE is the 21st Master of the Queen's Music and received much of her inspiration from her student days at King's College, Cambridge. The service also includes music by Grayston Ives (Magdalen), Charles H. Parry (Exeter) and Edward Naylor (Emmanuel). Please do join us for a reception after Evensong in the West Aisle.

### Speakers for the Nave's Sound System

We have become increasingly aware of the limitations of the sound system in the cathedral's nave. Parishioners and visitors alike are finding it very difficult to hear the officiant or homilist during services. **We have a solution, but we need your help.**

To equip the Cathedral with the same sound quality that we achieve at major services, such as Christmas and Easter (currently we rent equipment at approximately \$800 per service to achieve this sound) we need to purchase six speakers, stands and cables for a total cost of \$7700 + HST. Unfortunately, our budget does not have room for this expense. So, we are calling on the cathedral community to assist us. **If you feel moved to help improve the sound quality in the cathedral nave permanently, we hope you will consider donating.** Any donation amount will be greatly appreciated.

To donate, you can send in a donation by mail to the Cathedral office, or you can place it on the offertory in a designated envelope at worship. Any donation over \$20 is tax receipted.

Money raised over the cost of the speakers and equipment will go towards purchasing additional fans for the Nave and Chancel.
