MUSIC NOTE

We are delighted to welcome the Choir of St. Peter and St. Simon-the-Apostle and their Director of Music, Robin Davis, as they join us to sing Choral Evensong this Sunday at 4:30pm. The anthem 'Ubi Caritas' by Paul Mealor was composed in 2011 for the Choir of Westminster Abbey to sing during the wedding ceremony of Prince William and Catherine Middleton. The introit 'If Ye Love Me' by Tallis was sung during the wedding of Meghan Markle and Prince Harry in 2018, but was composed in 1565 under the reign of Elizabeth I. Like most of the greatest Tudor compositions, it would be largely forgotten until the Tractarian Oxford Movement in the middle of the 19th Century revived a more Catholic ritualism from the Evangelical First Great Awakening which had predominated in the intervening centuries. One of the sopranos in the Parish Choir, Irene Courage, has been composing devotional music for a number of years, and we are honoured to sing her recent piece 'Communion' at 9:00am this Sunday. The composer Philip Stopford visited St. James in September 2018 to promote some of his work, and this Sunday at 11:00am we will be offering his Keble Missa Brevis (with its ecstatic Sanctus Movement) and another setting of 'If Ye Love Me', this time in a reflective stillness, laden with many jazz-infused harmonies. Please mark your diaries for a special anthem at Evensong on 16th June at 4:30pm where the choir will be offering Benjamin Britten's wild and wonderful setting of Christopher Smart's 'Rejoice in the Lamb'. This miniature cantata is unique in many ways, from its referral to a cat called Jeoffry, a hyper-active mouse, and finding the spirit of God in all things, from individual letters of the alphabet to flowers and bassoons.

A MESSAGE FROM YOUR WARDENS

The Colours over The Lady Altar The King's Silk Jack

June 6, 2019 marks the 75th Anniversary of the D-Day landings in Normandy, France, the start of the Allied invasion of Europe during World War Two. Likewise, Sorrel Day, observed annually on the second Sunday in June, marks the Battle of Mont Sorrel, which took place on the Western Front June 2 to 13, 1916, during World War One. In commemoration of the latter, we pass along two stories from Nancy Mallett, our Archivist & Museum Curator, about the colours over The Lady Altar, The King's Silk Jack of the Royal Regiment of Canada, and the Battle of Mont Sorrel.

Sorrel Day - In a flat landscape, 30-metre Mount Sorrel afforded commanding views over the British-occupied Ypres Salient. The 3rd Canadian Division were defending Mont Sorrel when, on June 2, 1916, German forces launched an attack that started with a heavy artillery bombardment. The artillery devastated the forward Canadian positions, killing hundreds. German infantry then advanced, capturing Canadian positions at Mont Sorrel and on two surrounding hills. A hastily organized counterattack on June 3 failed. British commanders attacked with the Canadian Corps during the early hours of June 13. In this major set-piece battle, the Canadians recaptured much of the lost ground at a cost of over 8,000 casualties. Having lost the first two phases of the battle, the Canadians, with British support, achieved victory in the final operation.

The King's Silk Jack - This King's colour was presented to 3rd Battalion, Canadian Expeditionary Force (CEF) in Moxhe, Belgium, on March 9, 1919. The 3rd Battalion, which took part in the Battle of Mont Sorrel, was disbanded in 1920 but a new unit, the Toronto Regiment, had been formed from its men and took possession of its colour. In 1927, the colour was placed in the council chamber at City Hall, where it hung until 1950. In 1936, the present-day Royal Regiment of Canada was formed from the Toronto Regiment and the Royal Grenadiers. On Sorrel Day in June 1950, the Mayor presented the King's Silk Jack to the Royal Regiment of Canada, whereupon it was marched to and laid up at St. James Cathedral, hanging today in the vicinity of the Lady Altar. Other predecessor units of the Royal Regiment of Canada include 123rd Battalion, CEF, which was commanded by Lieutenant-Colonel Walter Bernard Kingsmill, and 58th Battalion, CEF, which also saw action at Mont Sorrel. Today, the battle honour, "Mont Sorrel", is emblazoned on the regimental colour of the Royal Regiment of Canada.
