MUSIC NOTE

Robert Busiakiewicz is always happy to hear from potential members of the Choirs of St. James Cathedral, and welcomes inquiries to his office via dom@stjamescathedral.ca.

During the reign of King Edward VI (1547–1553) services had to be sung in English in brief and succinct style. Thomas Tallis' *Verily, Verily*, our communion motet at 9:00am, is an example of this new English anthem. A simple chordal style is retained throughout the anthem, yet both the harmony and melody reflect the sense of the text (John 6:53–56). At 11:00am the mass setting by Healey Willan was written for the Dedication Festival of Toronto's Church of St. Mary Magdalene in 1948. At the Dean's Installation Service at 4:30pm, Mozart's *Ave Verum Corpus* was composed within six months of Mozart's death. It integrates forward- and backward-looking stylistic elements expressing Eucharistic thoughts in a straightforward manner, much like Ralph Vaughan Williams' *O Taste and See*, also one of the composer's last sacred pieces, written for the 1953 coronation of Queen Elizabeth II.
