Mindful of the sure benefits of your Son's saving passion and glorious resurrection and that at last, you will gather up all things in Christ, we pray that they continue to enjoy the fullness of your promises as they share in your nearer presence; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God for ever and ever.

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Lighting the Candles in the Advent Wreath

First Candle – The Candle of Hope

Leader

As we continue to experience the grief of the loss of our loved ones, we light the first candle, the candle of **HOPE**. Like God's people centuries ago, we also look forward with hope to the coming of the Savior. The Psalmist says this, "And now, O Lord, for what do I wait? My hope is in you." (*Psalm 39:7*)

People

Lord, may that same hope burn within us.

The First Candle is lit.

Leader

Let us pray.

Lord as we prepare to celebrate the birth of Jesus, grant that the light of your love for us will help us to become lights and signs of hope in the lives of those around us. Prepare our hearts for the joy and gladness of your coming, for Jesus is our hope.

People

Amen.

Second Candle - The Candle of Peace

Leader

As we feel the anxiety of a Christmas, of worry for ourselves, and all who have suffered the loss of those dear to them, we light the Second Candle of Advent, the candle of **PEACE**. We are reminded that Jesus is the Prince of Peace and that through him peace is found.

The Second Candle is lit.

Leader

Let us pray.

Lord Jesus, Light of the World, the One who brings peace and saves your people from trouble. We ask that you would give us your peace. Help us today, and everyday to worship you, to hear your word, and to do your will. We ask this in the name of the one who was born in Bethlehem.

People

Amen.

Third Candle – The Candle of Joy

Leader

As we feel the pain of uncertainty, disruption in families, inequities in a troubled world, and the loneliness and grief of the pandemic, we light the candle of **JOY**. We remember the assuring words of God from the mouth of the prophet Isaiah: "Be glad and rejoice forever in what I am creating; for I am about to create Jerusalem as a joy, and its people as a delight." (*Isaiah 65:18*)

The Third Candle is lit.

Leader

Let us pray.

We joyfully praise you, O Lord, for the fulfillment of your promise of a Saviour. Thank you for the gift of salvation through the birth of your Son, Jesus. Create us anew as we wait, and help us to see your glory as you fill our lives with peace, hope and joy.

People Amen.

Fourth Candle - The Candle of Love

Leader

As we feel the burden of loneliness, the sense that no one can share our pain, we light the fourth candle, the candle of **LOVE**. The evangelist reminds us that "God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life". (*John 3:16*)

The Fourth Candle is lit.

Leader

Let us pray.

Lord, you promise that the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord. Thank you for giving us your Son. Help us to extend the love of Jesus to all those whom you've put in our lives, and to see others as you see them, as dearly beloved children of God.

People Amen.

and rise in glory.

Officiant

O God, whose blessed Son has sanctified and transfigured the use of material things: Received these doves, which we will now offer in memory of our loved ones who are no longer with us. May they be a reminder of the love, joy, and peace they shared with us and now share with you and all the saints in light; through Jesus Christ our Lord.
