

Welcome to St. James Cathedral

This sacred land is the territory of several Indigenous Nations - the Wendat, the Haudenosaunee, and the Anishnaabe, with special recognition to the Mississaugas of New Credit. THE PROCLAMATION OF THE WORD

The First Reading

Reader

Blow the trumpet in Zion; sound the alarm on my holy mountain! Let all the inhabitants of the land tremble, for the day of the Lord is coming, it is near – a day of darkness and gloom, a day of clouds and thick darkness! Like blackness spread upon the mountains a great and powerful army comes; their like has never been from of old, nor will be again after them in ages to come. Yet even now, says the Lord, return to me with all your heart, with fasting, with weeping, and with mourning; rend your hearts and not your clothing. Return to the Lord, your God, for he is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love, and relents from punishing. Who knows whether he will not turn and relent, and leave a blessing behind him, a grain offering and a drink offering for the Lord, your God? See, now is the acceptable time; see, now is the day of salvation! Homily

Invitation to a Holy Lent

Presider

Dear friends in Christ, every year at the time of the Christian Passover we celebrate our redemption through the death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. Lent is a time to prepare for this celebration and to renew our life in the paschal mystery. We begin this holy season by remembering our need for repentance, and for the mercy and forgiveness proclaimed in the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

We begin our journey to Easter with the sign of ashes, an ancient sign, speaking of the frailty and uncertainty of human life, and marking the penitence of the community as a whole. I invite you therefore, in the name of the Lord, to observe a holy Lent, by self-examination, penitence, prayer, fasting, and almsgiving, and by reading and meditating on the word of God.

Litany of Penitence

Presider Let us kneel before our Creator and Redeemer.

Please kneel, as you are able. Silence is kept for a time.

Leader Most holy and merciful God,

we confess to you, to one another, and to the whole communion of saints in heaven and on earth, that we have sinned by our own fault in thought, word, and deed; by what we have done, and by what we have left undone.

Leader We have not loved you with our whole heart, and mind, and strength. We have not loved our neighbours as ourselves. We have not forgiven others, as we have been forgiven.

All Have mercy on us, Lord.

Leader We have been deaf to your call to serve as Christ served us. We have not been true to the mind of Christ. We have grieved your Holy Spirit.

All Have mercy on us, Lord.

Leader We confess to you, Lord, all our past unfaithfulness: the pride, hypocrisy,

and impatience of our lives.

All We confess to you, Lord.

Leader Our self-indulgent appetites and ways, and our exploitation of other

people,

All We confess to you, Lord.

Leader Our anger at our own frustration, and our envy of those more fortunate

than ourselves,

All We confess to you, Lord.

Leader Our intemperate love of worldly goods and comforts, and our dishonesty

in daily life and work,

All We confess to you, Lord.

Leader Our negligence in prayer and worship and our failure to commend the

faith that is in us,

All We confess to you, Lord.

Leader Accept our repentance, Lord, for the wrongs we have done: for our

blindness to human need and suffering, and our indifference to injustice

and cruelty,

All Accept our repentance, Lord.

Leader For all false judgements, for uncharitable thoughts toward our neighbours,

and for our prejudice and contempt toward those who differ from us,

All Accept our repentance, Lord.

Leader For our waste and pollution of your creation, and our lack of concern for

those who come after us,

All Accept our repentance, Lord.

Leader Restore us, good Lord, and let your anger depart from us;

All Hear us, Lord, for your mercy is great.

ashes be for us a sign of our mortality and penitence, and a reminder that only by your gracious gift are we given eternal life; through Jesus Christ

our Saviour.

Dear friends, if you are present or elsewhere and are unable to receive the sacrament at this time, I invite you to join me and the whole church in spiritual communion to receive Christ, who is present in this Sacrament of the Altar. Let us pray.

- When coming forward to receive communion, please follow the directions of the sidespeople. Please remain in your pew until they indicate that it is your turn to go up to receive the sacrament.
- Please maintain physical distancing when coming forward for the sacrament.
- There are two communion ministers at the service. Please stop after the hand sanitizer station to wait for the communion minister on your side to be free.
- Proceed to the communion minister on your side of the centre aisle, keeping a safe distance.
- Extend your hands for the words of distribution, when the host will be dropped on your palm.
- Move all the way to the marked spot on the left or right before removing your mask and consuming the sacrament. There is a hand sanitizer station on either side.
- Please return to your seat using the side aisles.
