Welcome to St. James Cathedral

This sacred land is the territory of several Indigenous Nations - the Wendat, the Haudenosaunee, and the Anishnaabe, with special recognition to the Mississaugas of New Credit. We also acknowledge that we are on the shores of Niigaani-gichigami/Lake Ontario. This territory is governed by the Dish With One Spoon Wampum Belt Treaty, an agreement between the Haudenosaunee Confederacy and the Anishnaabe Confederacy to peaceably share and sustain the life of the Great Lakes. In the spirit of that Treaty we seek to place at the centre of our gatherings the values of respectful reciprocity, diversity, peace, responsibility, and mutual aid.



The First Reading

Acts 16: 16-34

Reader

One day, as we were going to the place of prayer, we met a slave-girl who had a spirit of divination and brought her owners a great deal of money by fortune-telling. While she followed Paul and us, she would cry out, "These men are slaves of the Most High God, who proclaim to you a way of salvation." She kept doing this for many days. But Paul, very much annoyed, turned and said to the spirit, "I order you in the name of Jesus Christ to come out of her." And it came out that very hour.

But when her owners saw that their hope of making money was gone, they seized Paul and Silas and dragged them into the market-place before the authorities. When they had brought them before the magistrates, they said, "These men are disturbing our city; they are Jews and are advocating customs that are not lawful for us as Romans to adopt or observe." The crowd joined in attacking them, and the magistrates had them stripped of their clothing and ordered them to be beaten with rods. After they had given them a severe flogging, they threw them into prison and ordered the jailer to keep them securely. Following these instructions, he put them in the innermost cell and fastened their feet in the stocks. About midnight Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns to God, and the prisoners were listening to them.

Suddenly there was an earthquake, so violent that the foundations of the prison were shaken; and immediately all the doors were opened and everyone's chains were unfastened. When the jailer woke up and saw the prison doors wide open, he drew his sword and was about to kill himself, since he supposed that the prisoners had escaped. But Paul shouted in a loud voice, "Do not harm yourself, for we are all here." The jailer called for lights, and rushing in, he fell down trembling before Paul and Silas. Then he brought them outside and said, "Sirs, what must I do to be saved?" They answered, "Believe on the Lord Jesus, and you will be saved, you and your household." They spoke the word of the Lord to him and to all who were in his house. At the same hour of the night he took them and washed their wounds; then he and his entire family were baptized without delay. He brought them up into the house and set food before them; and he and his entire household rejoiced that he had become a believer in God.





Godly Play

“Hm. I wonder what this could be? It’s gold, so there must be something very precious inside. Parables are precious, even more precious than gold. Maybe there is a parable inside this box.”

In our first few weeks of *Godly Play*, we have been telling parables. The parable stories are kept in gold boxes, and every time we learn a new parable, we start with the words above. We remember that parables are precious, that they are gifts that belong to each of us, and that they have a lid on them, and are sometimes hard to enter into.

This echoes what St. Augustine says of parables—that they are stumbling blocks, meant to trip us up and cause us to question what we think we know. They invite us to see ourselves and God in a different and sometimes unexpected light—which is indeed a precious gift, if sometimes an uncomfortable one.

The purpose of a curriculum like *Godly Play* is to invite children to enter into the wild and beautiful stories of Scripture without telling them up front what the answer is. Instead, we accompany them as we discover together the breadth and depth of meaning in Scripture, trusting in the Holy Spirit to be at work in them as well as in the teachers and greeters.

In *Godly Play* over the next months and years, the volunteer teachers will tell many stories from Scripture, not just parables. We are just getting started! And I ask for your prayers for those who have already volunteered to tell the stories and to welcome the kids.

I also ask your prayers for every child who walks through our Cathedral doors—that they would know that they too are recipients of the gifts of God, given to us in Scripture and through the Church, by the grace of the Holy Spirit. Thanks be to God!

An Anniversary Year 1797-2022: *Did You Know?*

In 1797 the first Anglican priest, the Reverend Thomas Raddish, arrived in York, as Toronto was called then, and locations were determined for a market – the predecessor of today’s St. Lawrence Market, a school, a hospital, and a church.

Finding “Muddy York” not to his taste, Rev. Raddish soon returned to England. In between his departure and the arrival of the Reverend George Okill Stuart in 1801, religious services were led occasionally by visiting rectors from Kingston and Niagara and by lay parishioners, including tavern-keeper William Cooper who preached out of a book of published sermons.
