## Homily

### The Nicene Creed

Wherefore, O Father, Lord of heaven and earth, we thy humble servants, with all thy holy Church, remembering the precious death of thy beloved Son, his mighty resurrection, and glorious ascension, and looking for his coming again in glory, do make before thee, in this sacrament of the holy bread of eternal life and the cup of everlasting salvation, the memorial which he hath commanded:


James is an example of seriousness in the proclamation of the truth. He was the first martyr among the apostles themselves, and so he was the first to enter into the joy of his Lord.

Many believe that the remains of St. James are buried in Santiago de Compostela, Spain, and thousands of people make pilgrimages of faith each year.
