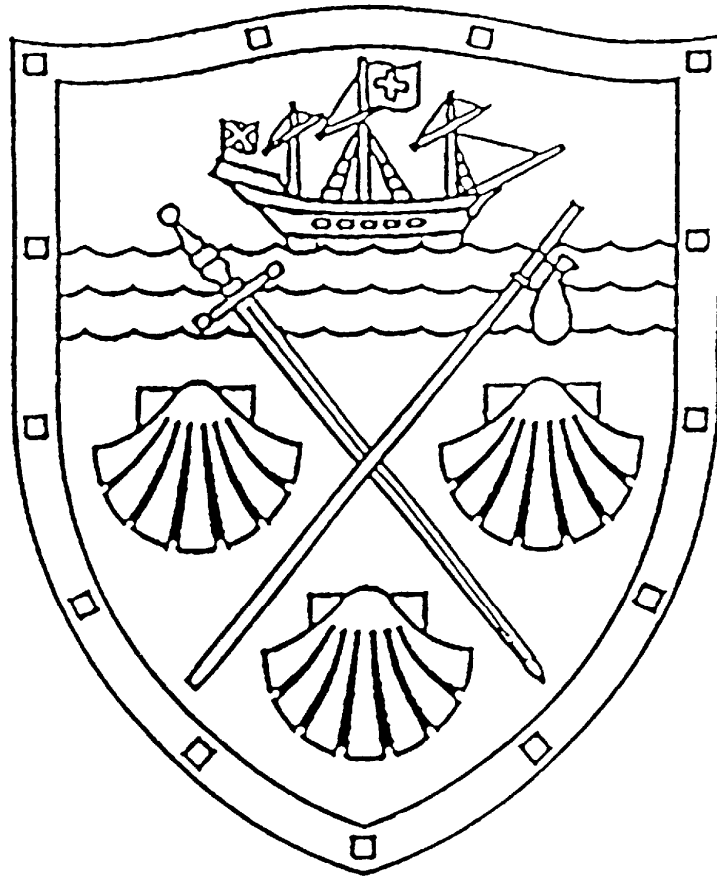

Welcome to St. James Cathedral

This sacred land is the territory of several Indigenous Nations - the Wendat, the Haudenosaunee, and the Anishnaabe, with special recognition to the Mississaugas of the Credit First Nation. We also acknowledge that we are on the shores of Niigaani-gichigami/Lake Ontario. This territory is governed by the Dish With One Spoon Wampum Belt Treaty, an agreement between the Haudenosaunee Confederacy and the Anishnaabe Confederacy to peaceably share and sustain the life of the Great Lakes. In the spirit of that Treaty we seek to place at the centre of our gatherings the values of respectful reciprocity, diversity, peace, responsibility, and mutual aid.

Liturgical Note

In the context of Christian Liturgy, Israel does not refer to the current political state, but either to the historic Hebrews of the ancient Near East or, in Christian theology, to all people who put their faith and trust in Jesus Christ.



The Second Reading

1 Corinthians 3: 1-9

Reader And so, brothers and sisters, I could not speak to you as spiritual people, but rather as people of the flesh, as infants in Christ. I fed you with milk, not solid food, for you were not ready for solid food. Even now you are still not ready, for you are still of the flesh. For as long as there is jealousy and quarreling among you, are you not of the flesh, and behaving according to human inclinations? For when one says, "I belong to Paul," and another, "I belong to Apollos," are you not merely human? What then is Apollos? What is Paul? Servants through whom you came to believe, as the Lord assigned to each. I planted, Apollos watered, but God gave the growth. So neither the one who plants nor the one who waters is anything, but only God who gives the growth. The one who plants and the one who waters have a common purpose, and each will receive wages according to the labour of each. For we are God's servants, working together; you are God's field, God's building.

The Holy Gospel

Matthew 5: 21-37

Gospeller The Lord be with you.

Gospeller Jesus said "You have heard that it was said to those of ancient times, 'You shall not murder'; and 'whoever murders shall be liable to judgment.' But I say to you that if you are angry with a brother or sister, you will be liable to judgment; and if you insult a brother or sister, you will be liable to the council; and if you say, 'You fool,' you will be liable to the hell of fire.

So when you are offering your gift at the altar, if you remember that your brother or sister has something against you, leave your gift there before the altar and go; first be reconciled to your brother or sister, and then come and offer your gift. Come to terms quickly with your accuser while you are on the way to court with him, or your accuser may hand you over to the judge, and the judge to the guard, and you will be thrown into prison. Truly I tell you, you will never get out until you have paid the last penny.

You have heard that it was said, 'You shall not commit adultery.' But I say to you that everyone who looks at a woman with lust has already committed adultery with her in his heart. If your right eye causes you to sin, tear it out and throw it away; it is better for you to lose one of your members than for your whole body to be thrown into hell. And if your right hand causes you to sin, cut it off and throw it away; it is better for you to lose one of your members than for your whole body to go into hell. It was also said, 'Whoever divorces his wife, let him give her a certificate of divorce.' But I say to you that anyone who divorces his wife, except on the ground of unchastity, causes her to commit adultery; and whoever marries a divorced woman commits adultery.

Again, you have heard that it was said to those of ancient times, 'You shall not swear falsely, but carry out the vows you have made to the Lord.' But I say to you, Do not swear at all, either by heaven, for it is the throne of God, or by the earth, for it is his footstool, or by Jerusalem, for it is the city of the great King. And do not swear by your head, for you cannot make one hair white or black. Let your word be 'Yes, Yes' or 'No, No'; anything more than this comes from the evil one.







You were Asking...Anointing



This week we are launching an occasional article, responding to a question that has come to our attention.

This week the question is: *What is anointing for healing?*

Anointing with oil happens at baptism, as part of our regular healing ministry and at the time of death. Olive oil and chrism (olive oil scented with balsam extract) are consecrated by the Bishop during Holy Week (at the *Chrism Mass*) and set aside for these occasions. Anointing with chrism is one of the ancient baptismal practices. A sign of the Holy Spirit, *chrism* also interprets the name Christ, the *anointed one*.

In our baptism, the sign of the cross is traced with chrism on our forehead, marking us as Christ's own forever.

Unscented consecrated olive oil is used in the sacrament of healing and with someone who is dying. Anointing for healing is an outward sign of the inward healing presence of God – healing of body, soul, and mind. It is also a sign of forgiveness and reconciliation in and within the Christian community.

While it can be offered by licensed lay people, presently anointing for healing is offered by the Cathedral clergy, occasionally at the 9:00am and regularly at the 11:00am Celebrations of the Eucharist. The sign of the cross is traced on our forehead with the oil as this prayer (or one similar) is said:

N, through this holy anointing may the Lord in his love and mercy uphold you by the grace and power of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Additional prayers are sometimes offered, depending on personal requests. Everyone is welcome to receive prayers for healing an anointing. As the old adage goes, “all may, some should, none must”!

Thanks for asking. Just let me know if you'd like to delve into this further.
