

Welcome to St. James Cathedral

This sacred land is the territory of several Indigenous Nations - the Wendat, the Haudenosaunee, and the Anishnaabe, with special recognition to the Mississaugas of the Credit First Nation. We also acknowledge that we are on the shores of Niigaani-gichigami/Lake Ontario. This territory is governed by the Dish With One Spoon Wampum Belt Treaty, an agreement between the Haudenosaunee Confederacy and the Anishnaabe Confederacy to peaceably share and sustain the life of the Great Lakes. In the spirit of that Treaty we seek to place at the centre of our gatherings the values of respectful reciprocity, diversity, peace, responsibility, and mutual aid.

Genesis 1:1-2:4a

Reader

In the beginning when God created the heavens and the earth, the earth was a formless void and darkness covered the face of the deep, while a wind from God swept over the face of the waters. Then God said, 'Let there be light'; and there was light. And God saw that the light was good; and God separated the light from the darkness. God called the light Day, and the darkness he called Night. And there was evening and there was morning, the first day.

And God said, 'Let there be a dome in the midst of the waters, and let it separate the waters from the waters.' So God made the dome and separated the waters that were under the dome from the waters that were above the dome. And it was so. God called the dome Sky. And there was evening and there was morning, the second day.

And God said, 'Let the waters under the sky be gathered together into one place, and let the dry land appear.' And it was so. God called the dry land Earth, and the waters that were gathered together he called Seas. And God saw that it was good. The earth brought forth vegetation: plants yielding seed of every kind, and trees of every kind bearing fruit with the seed in it. And God saw that it was good. And God said, 'Let there be lights in the dome of the sky to separate the day from the night; and let them be for signs and for seasons and for days and years, and let them be lights in the dome of the sky to give light upon the earth.' And it was so. God made the two great lights—the greater light to rule the day and the lesser light to rule the night—and the stars.

God set them in the dome of the sky to give light upon the earth, to rule over the day and over the night, and to separate the light from the darkness. And God saw that it was good. And there was evening and there was morning, the fourth day.

And God said, 'Let the waters bring forth swarms of living creatures, and let birds fly above the earth across the dome of the sky.' So God created the great sea monsters and every living creature that moves, of every kind, with which the waters swarm, and every winged bird of every kind. And God saw that it was good. And God said, 'Let the earth bring forth living creatures of every kind: cattle and creeping things and wild animals of the earth of every kind.' And it was so. God made the wild animals of the earth of every kind, and the cattle of every kind, and everything that creeps upon the ground of every kind. And God saw that it was good.

Then God said, 'Let us make humankind in our image, according to our likeness; and let them have dominion over the fish of the sea, and over the birds of the air, and over the cattle, and over all the wild animals of the earth, and over every creeping thing that creeps upon the earth.'

So God created humankind in his image, in the image of God he created them; male and female he created them.

God blessed them, and God said to them, 'Be fruitful and multiply, and fill the earth and subdue it; and have dominion over the fish of the sea and over the birds of the air and over every living thing that moves upon the earth.' God said, 'See, I have given you every plant yielding seed that is upon the face of all the earth, and every tree with seed in its fruit; you shall have them for food. 

TRINITY SUNDAY

This week we come to Trinity Sunday, a day to mark and celebrate God's nature, *Trinitas*, three in one – Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Every Sunday is Trinity Sunday and try as we do, it is all but impossible to describe the Trinity in words alone. Imagining and expressing the nature of God has been the work of painters, iconographers, musicians, dancers, and poets for centuries!

We are fortunate to have a spectacular example of that creativity in our Baptistry, on the east side of the Cathedral. Take some time to look at the Trinity Banner on the north wall of the Baptistry. Designed and executed by renowned Canadian painter Doris McCarthy in 1957, here is how the artist describes her banner: The Trinity banner is an expression in picture language of the doctrine of the Trinity as found in the creeds. God the Father is symbolized by the figure in the gold bejewelled crown. God the Son incarnate is shown in his own body on the cross. God the Holy Spirit is represented by the dove surrounded by Pentecostal tongues of fire. These Three in One are here imagined enthroned in heaven with the earth as a footstool.

For me, it is an icon in appliqué inviting us to see into and beyond the image. Holy, holy, holy, Lord God Almighty!

June 4th also marks **Refugee Sunday** in our Diocese. It is an opportunity to become more aware of this global humanitarian crisis and learn how to be involved. The St James Cathedral Community Refugee Committee began as a response to the Syrian refugee crisis in 2015. This edition of Connections directs you to important updates and ways to respond. And let's listen for the leading of the Spirit as we pray, *Loving God, open our hearts and minds to see what you see, to love as you love, to give as you have given, so that your promised justice would become reality in our world. Amen.*
