### Artist-in-Residence: Silas Friesen

As you will hear on the video, Silas is a fabulous composer and arranger. He is also a trumpet player, and a theologian, currently studying at Tyndale College. This new arrangement, called 'Song of Invitation', is a motet for the time of Pentecost. It is based upon music and text by Mike Janzen. The video features the combined talents of members of the cathedral choir in rehearsal, with Tom Bell playing flute, and Nathan Jeffrey on the podium. Thank you, Silas, for your music. We look forward to your music ringing round the rafters of the Cathedral this year and beyond.

Silas Friesen is a Toronto-based multi-instrumentalist, arranger, composer, and educator from a musical family of eight. Active in multiple idioms, Silas is frequently commissioned by the Saskatoon Jazz Orchestra. When the pandemic curtailed live music, he formed the Silas Friesen Virtual Jazz Orchestra to record a trio of his pieces. Silas is currently pursuing graduate theological study at Tyndale Seminary and is one of the Music Coordinators at Little Trinity Anglican Church.
