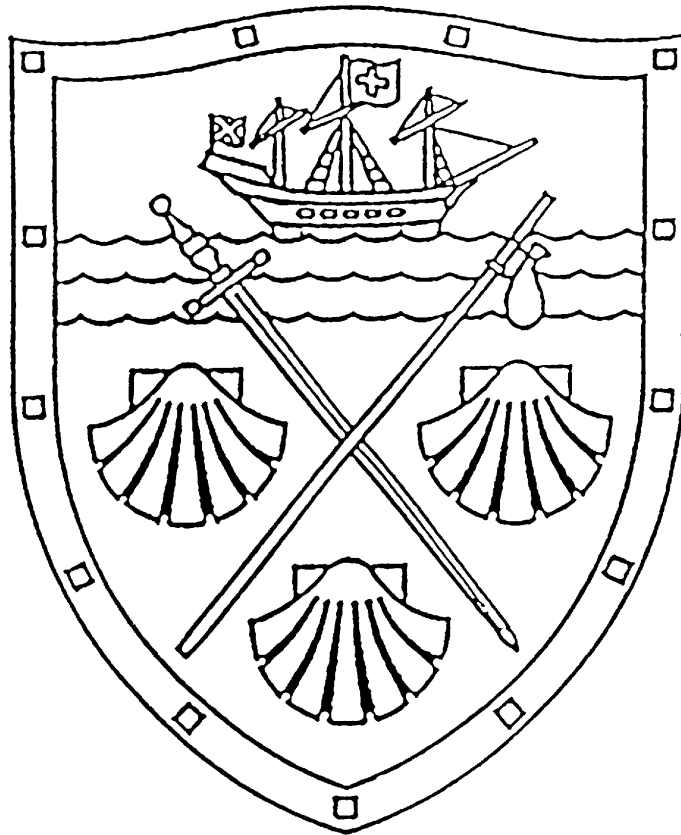

Welcome to St. James Cathedral

This sacred land is the territory of several Indigenous Nations - the Wendat, the Haudenosaunee, and the Anishnaabe, and the Métis peoples, with special recognition to the Mississaugas of New Credit. We also acknowledge that we are on the shores of Niigaani-gichigami/Lake Ontario. This territory is governed by the Dish With One Spoon Wampum Belt Treaty, an agreement between the Haudenosaunee Confederacy and the Anishnaabe Confederacy to peaceably share and sustain the life of the Great Lakes. In the spirit of that Treaty we seek to place at the centre of our gatherings the values of respectful reciprocity, diversity, peace, responsibility, and mutual aid.

Liturgical Note

In the context of Christian Liturgy, Israel does not refer to the current political state, but either to the historic Hebrews (also called Israelites) of the ancient Near East or, in Christian theology, to all people who put their faith and trust in Jesus Christ.

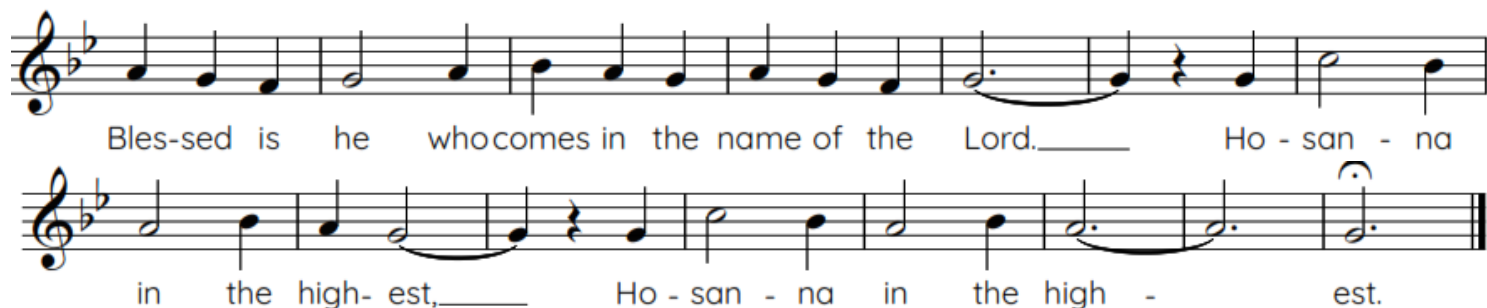

Presider


the author of our salvation; by whom, and with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory are yours, almighty Father, now and for ever.



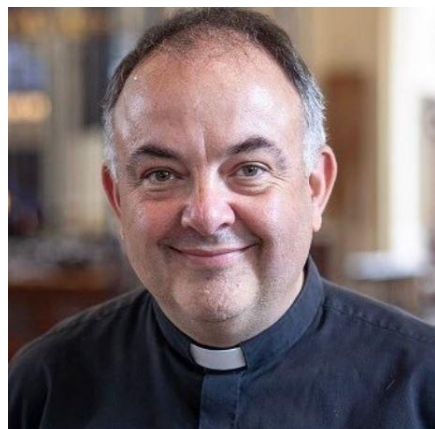
STAY UP TO DATE

Hearing the Gospel in Lent – Save the dates!



The Season of Lent had its beginnings as a final preparation for Baptism at Easter. But we all need the opportunity Easter gives us to reaffirm the Covenant of our own Baptism. And the heart of our experience in Lent is our encounter with the particular gospel stories we hear on Sunday. But these key stories must be heard in the context of the bigger story: Jesus' determination to take his Gospel of the Kingdom of God up to Jerusalem.
