## **First Lesson**

*Isaiah 47:1-15*

*Reader*

Come down and sit in the dust, virgin daughter Babylon! Sit on the ground without a throne, daughter Chaldea! For you shall no more be called tender and delicate. Take the millstones and grind meal, remove your veil, strip off your robe, uncover your legs, pass through the rivers. Your nakedness shall be uncovered, and your shame shall be seen. I will take vengeance, and I will spare no one. Our Redeemer—the Lord of hosts is his name—is the Holy One of Israel. Sit in silence, and go into darkness, daughter Chaldea! For you shall no more be called the mistress of kingdoms. I was angry with my people, I profaned my heritage; I gave them into your hand, you showed them no mercy; on the aged you made your yoke exceedingly heavy. You said, ‘I shall be mistress for ever’, so that you did not lay these things to heart or remember their end.

Now therefore hear this, you lover of pleasures, who sit securely, who say in your heart, ‘I am, and there is no one besides me; I shall not sit as a widow or know the loss of children’— both these things shall come upon you in a moment, in one day: the loss of children and widowhood shall come upon you in full measure, in spite of your many sorceries and the great power of your enchantments.

You felt secure in your wickedness; you said, ‘No one sees me.’ Your wisdom and your knowledge led you astray, and you said in your heart, ‘I am, and there is no one besides me.’ But evil shall come upon you, which you cannot charm away; disaster shall fall upon you, which you will not be able to ward off; and ruin shall come on you suddenly, of which you know nothing.

Stand fast in your enchantments and your many sorceries, with which you have laboured from your youth; perhaps you may be able to succeed,

perhaps you may inspire terror. You are wearied with your many consultations; let those who study the heavens stand up and save you, those who gaze at the stars and at each new moon predict what shall befall you.

See, they are like stubble, the fire consumes them; they cannot deliver themselves from the power of the flame. No coal for warming oneself is this, no fire to sit before! Such to you are those with whom you have laboured, who have trafficked with you from your youth; they all wander about in their own paths; there is no one to save you.

## The Installation of Honorary Canons

*The Canons-Designate shall stand before the Bishop at the foot of the chancel steps. The Registrar will read the Bishop's mandate. The Bishop shall then question the Canons-Designate:*

*Bishop* Will you promise to perform loyally and faithfully all such duties of ministry as you may be called upon to perform in our Diocese?

*Answer* I will.

*Bishop* Will you help further the life and witness of the Church in this Diocese, both in your work and in your prayers, and diligently exhort those among whom you minister to do the same?

*Answer* I will, God being my helper.

*Bishop* Will you, so far as in you lies, perform gladly and willingly the duties pertaining to this office which shall be required of you?

*Answer* I will.

*Then each Canon-Designate shall kneel as able in turn before the Bishop.*

*The Bishop will say:*

*Bishop* I, Andrew, Bishop of this Diocese, do install you, – Julie, Andrea, Alison, Andrew, Anita, David, Janet, Rob, Lisa, Jesse, Mark, Kevin – as a Canon of this our Cathedral Church, in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.
