Welcome to St. James Cathedral

This sacred land is the territory of several Indigenous Nations - the Wendat, the Haudenosaunee, and the Anishnaabe, and the Métis peoples, with special recognition to the Mississaugas of New Credit. In the context of Christian Liturgy, Israel does not refer to the current political state, but either to the historic Hebrews (also called Israelites) of the ancient Near East or, in Christian theology, to all people who put their faith and trust in Jesus Christ.

Born in Jamaica and a graduate of Ontario Bible College (Tyndale), University of Waterloo and Wycliffe College, Toronto School of Theology, University of Toronto, The Rev. Dr. Michael Blair serves the General Council of the United Church of Canada as the General Secretary. He is the first person of African descent to serve in this role. Before his appointment, he served as Executive Minister for Ethnic Ministry and Church in Mission, and as the Executive Director of the Toronto Christian Resource Center (CRC) in Regent Park. He previously served as a congregational minister of several Baptist churches in Toronto and St. Catherine's and as a community chaplain with the Ontario Multifaith Council's Reintegration Program. He currently serves as a member and moderator of the Commission on World Mission and Evangelism, World Council of Churches.

Monday, March 18: Easter Memorial Flowers



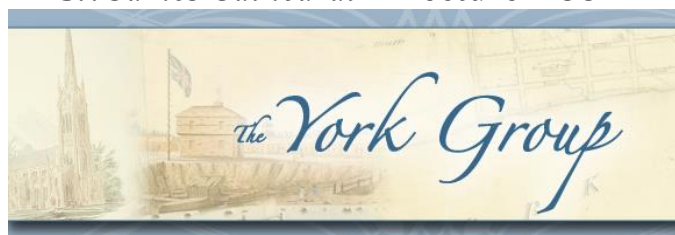
A beautiful way to remember a loved one at Easter is through the memorial flowers that will be placed in the Cathedral for the season.
