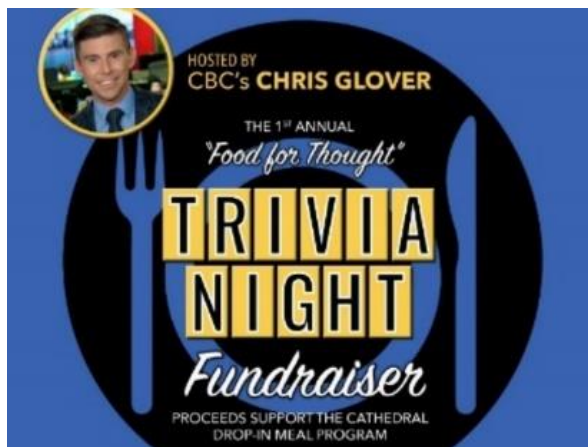

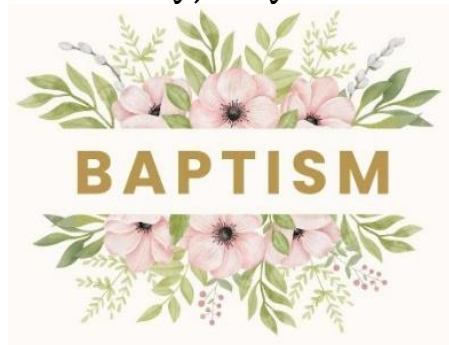

Sunday, May 19 at 11:00am: Celebration of Baptism. Preparation begins soon!

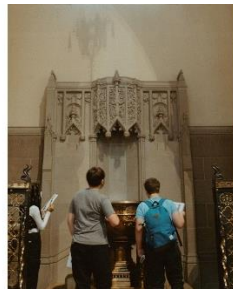
