Welcome to St. James Cathedral

This sacred land is the territory of several Indigenous Nations - the Wendat, the Haudenosaunee, and the Anishnaabe, and the Métis peoples, with special recognition to the Mississaugas of New Credit. We also acknowledge that we are on the shores of Niigaani-gichigami/Lake Ontario. This territory is governed by the Dish With One Spoon Wampum Belt Treaty, an agreement between the Haudenosaunee Confederacy and the Anishnaabe Confederacy to peaceably share and sustain the life of the Great Lakes. In the spirit of that Treaty we seek to place at the centre of our gatherings the values of respectful reciprocity, diversity, peace, responsibility, and mutual aid.

In the context of Christian Liturgy, Israel does not refer to the current political state, but either to the historic Hebrews of the ancient Near East or, in Christian theology, to all people who put their faith and trust in Jesus Christ.

The Order of the Holy Cross (OHC) is an international Anglican monastic order that follows the Rule of St. Benedict. It was founded in 1884 by the Rev. James Huntington, an Episcopal priest, in New York City. The order moved to Maryland briefly before settling in West Park, New York, in 1902. The Bishop of Toronto, the Most Reverend Lewis Garnsworthy invited the OHC to form a Priory in the diocese. Holy Cross Priory was established in 1973.

The Brothers joined the Sisterhood of St. John the Divine, the Community of the Sisters of the Church, and the Society of St. John the Evangelist in providing monastic witness and ministry in Canada. Although the greater part of the Order's work was in the Diocese of Toronto, through the admission of Associates, OHC was a part of the larger life of the Anglican Church of Canada.

OHC Brothers have been involved in many aspects of parish and diocesan life: Christian Education, incumbents of parishes, associate priests, honorary assistants, chaplains, spiritual directors, confessors, counselors, volunteers, committee members, and delegates to General and Diocesan Synods.

Although the Priory at 204 High Park Avenue will close on May 22, 2024, the Order's work in Toronto will continue. OHC Brothers Brian Youngward, Leonard Abbah, and Reginald Crenshaw are residents and will offer their gifts and abilities as needed and as possible. Thank you for the prayers, encouragement, financial gifts, and love given to us.

And there will be no more night; they need no light of lamp or sun, for the Lord God will be their light, and they will reign for ever and ever.
