### All Saints' Sunday

We mark the days between October 31 and November 2 as *Hallowtide* - a triduum in the Christian calendar consisting of three days of reflection, prayer, and thanksgiving for those who have died.

It is also a time when we renew our pledge as people of prayer and people of hope and promise. *All Hallows Even* (from which we derive "Hallowe'en") is followed by *All Hallows* on November 1 (All Saints' Day), and finally by *All Souls' Day* on November 2.

Like the Cathedral, many parish churches mark these holy days on *All Saints' Sunday*, when our liturgies place an accent on remembrance and thanksgiving. This is part of our Christian life and tradition in which we confront death with the mighty victory of the cross and God's work in and through the faithful. In such as time as this, our prayers for those who mourn and all who have died take on even more poignancy.

All Saints' Sunday is a day to remember and give thanks for that great cloud of witnesses – men and women who are distinguished by their extravagant love of God, which shines brighter than anything else about them. They are ordinary men and women whose love of God led them to do extraordinary things; and they provide us with examples of Christian living at its best.

In fact, many Anglican parish churches are named for a patron saint – Mary, James, Andrew, Michael, Matthew, Anne, Luke, and many others. The church at its best is an incubator for sainthood and perhaps that's why All Saints' Sunday is one of the days of the year when we celebrate Holy Baptism. Today, on November 5th we celebrate the baptism of Jacqueline, Andy, and Darkiel and the renewal of Michael's vows. We join with them in renewing our own Baptismal Covenant and the six promises that give our life meaning and direction. Let's pray for them and welcome them into God's family as people of hope and promise. And let's all respond as followers with deep commitment and hope, saying *I will with God's Help!*


