No Peace in the Land of the Holy One

"Death, injury, grief, loss of homes and livelihoods is on a scale not seen in these lands since 1967. Everyone is shocked by the extreme violence which has broken out. All killings of innocents and targeting of children and women must be condemned. But the trouble has been brewing for years. A system which subjects two million West Bank Palestinians to military occupation and also incarcerates two million Gazans in an open-air

prison is unsustainable and will inevitably lead to extreme violence". (The Very Revd Canon Richard Sewell, St. George's College, Jerusalem).

We are horrified at the brutality and carnage that was visited upon the patrons at the Supernova Music Festival where approximately *260 people died*. Such attacks on innocent civilians must be condemned and condemned again. In the same breath, we must condemn the way Palestinians continue to be treated in their own land.

I am a witness to the horrendous conditions under which Palestinians live in the Land of the Holy One. I saw it in Dheisheh (2010) and again in Hebron (2013). It was bad in Dheisheh, it was bad in Hebron. In Hebron, we saw a fence (not a wall, that is another story). This fence separated Palestinian and Israeli children. On one side of the fence, one set of children was playing on slides in an area with lush green lawns. On the other side, another set was begging tourists and pilgrims for money as they battled the dust of the barren land). One cannot begin to imagine the impact that such an experience will have on the psyche and development of those children.

I met a man who had the key his father took when he had to flee his home during the 1948 expulsion. People have kept their keys to this day with the hope of returning to their homes. Western governments can no longer pretend that this horror does not exist or will just go away. This problem was created by the United Nations, and I believe that it is up to the UN to resolve it.

As the death toll rises above 5,000, we continue to agitate and pray for peace and that God will shine the light of God's presence in the land where the spiritual seed of Abraham, Palestinians, Jews, and Christians, are its joint stewards.

We pray that the beams of that light show the way of justice and mercy and a vision of peace, turning hatred into love, fear into trust, and despair into hope.

Sunday, November 12 at 4:30pm: Celebrating Barbados 57th Anniversary of Independence


