# National Day for Truth & Reconciliation



Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. reminded us of a statement made by Theodore Parker, a Unitarian minister who called for the abolition of slavery. In the third of "Ten Sermons of Religion" published in 1853, titled "Of Justice and the Conscience", Parker said, "I do not pretend to understand the moral universe, the arc is a long one, my eye reaches but little ways I cannot calculate the curve and complete the figure by the experience of sight; I can divine it by conscience. But from what I see I am sure it bends towards justice".

That arc touches our First Nations, Métis, and Inuit siblings. Survivors of the residential school system in Canada that operated between 1867 and 1996 advocated for recognition and reparations and demanded accountability for the intergenerational impacts of the harm caused. Their efforts culminated in The Indian Residential Schools Settlement Agreement (May 8, 2006), the establishment of the Truth and Reconciliation Commission (June 2, 2008), an apology by the government (June 11, 2008), and the creation of the National Centre for Truth and Reconciliation in the fall of 2015.


Thirteen years before the agreement, the late Archbishop Michael Peers brought our church into this arc with his historic confession and apology. "I acknowledge and I confess before God and you, our failures in the residential schools. We failed you. We failed ourselves. We failed God. am sorry, more than I can say, that we were part of a system that took you and your children from home and family. I am sorry, more than I can say, that we tried to remake you in our image, taking from you your language and the signs of your identity. I am sorry, more than I can say, that in our schools so many were abused physically, sexually, culturally, and emotionally. On behalf of the Anglican Church of Canada, I present our apology."

Our work of healing continues. I invite us to use September 30 for the purpose for which it is intended, to recognize the legacy of Canada's residential school system and for us to continue to learn the many truths of this blight on our nation's history. We must not rest in our efforts to rectify and transform the systemic and structural injustices that were established by the cultural genocide perpetrated against First Nations, Métis, and Inuit children and communities in our country.
