

As Dean of St George's College, Richard runs the Anglican centre for pilgrimage in the Holy Land. The College runs 24 pilgrimages per year which visit the holy places but also gives all pilgrims the chance to meet the people of the Land and to gain clear insights into historical and current political realities.

Friday, October 11: Donate for St. James Drop-In on Thanksgiving Day












