The Advent Wreath: Candles of Hope, Peace, Joy and Love



A new liturgical year dawns! It begins with the Advent season.

Dietrich Bonhoeffer said, "The celebration of Advent is possible only to those who are troubled in soul, who know themselves to be poor and imperfect, and who look forward to something greater to come." For me, the significance of these words is magnified when I call to mind the four themes that we pray during the four weeks of the season. I share these "notes" to remind those who know and to teach those who do not, about the symbolism of the candles in the Advent Wreath.

The four candles of Advent symbolize the themes of Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love. A fifth candle, The Christ Candle, is lit at Christmas time to represent the birth of Jesus. It is white and larger than the other candles and is placed in the center of the wreath.

- The first candle (Hope), sometimes called the Prophecy Candle, recalls the prophet Isaiah's telling of the promises of God to God's people and the birth of the one who would be the agent of liberation for the people.
- **The Peace**/*Bethlehem Candle*, the second candle in the wreath, not only speaks to us about the peace for which we yearn, the peace that Christ offers, but also reminds us of the journey of Mary and Joseph from Nazareth to Bethlehem where the Prince of Peace was born, and from where the light of peace shone forth for all the world, even to this day.
- The pink candle, the symbol of **Joy**, burns on the third Sunday of Advent, also called *Guadete* Sunday. "Guadete" means "rejoice". It is an invitation to joy in the joy of the shepherds who were the first to hear the good news of great joy from the angelic chorus. This third candle is also called the "Shepherd's Candle".
- The fourth candle, also called the "Angel's Candle", represents Love, the ultimate love of God manifested in the life and work of Jesus. It is this love that we proclaim in word and deed as we share in the mission of God, engendering hope, in the lives of the hopeless, making for peace, for we are the children of God, and bringing joy to many a broken heart.

I commend the Advent Wreath as a useful means of devotion at the family table. We will light these candles in the cathedral every Sunday and every Wednesday evening during our weekly ZOOM conversations.
