JANE FINGLER, SOPRANO

Jane Fingler is a Toronto-based soprano from Winnipeg who keeps very busy performing as an ensemble singer and soloist with groups such as Tafelmusik Baroque Choir, The Trinity Bach Project, The Theatre of Early Music, The Toronto Consort, Toronto Mendelssohn Choir, and is a founding member of Toronto-based Diapente Renaissance Quintet (formed in 2022). Recent solo highlights

include three performances of Handel's "lost" *Gloria (HWV Deest)* and Bach's *BWV 72* with the Trinity Bach Project, Handel's *Dixit Dominus* with Theatre of Early Music/U of T's Schola Cantorum, and the Toronto Mendelssohn Singers, Bach's *BWV 39* with the Oakville Community Chorus, Handel's *Brockes Passion* and Bach's *Markus Passion* with Metropolitan Festival Choir and Baroque Orchestra, and Monteverdi *Vespers* and Bach's *St. John Passion* at the Winnipeg Baroque Festival. Other past solo performances include those with the Winnipeg and Regina Symphony Orchestras, the Early Music Alberta Festival, The Okanogan Festival Chorus, The Peterborough Singers, and the Ottawa Bach Choir. She has performed various contemporary works with Toronto ensembles Choir 21 and Opus 8, and Dead of Winter and Polycoro in Winnipeg. She is also currently pursuing a DMA in Historical Performance at the University of Toronto.



MARJORIE MALTAIS, MEZZO SOPRANO

Marjorie Maltais has gained an excellent reputation on both concert and operatic stages throughout North America. A native of Clermont, Quebec, Marjorie won First Prize at the Ottawa Choral Society's *New Discoveries Competition* in 2016, leading to engagements with Grand Philharmonic Choir, Chorus Niagara, Peterborough Singers and Choeur-St-Laurent.

Recent highlights for this engaging young artist include a brilliant debut with Boston Early Music Festival in performances of *Versailles: Portrait of a Royal Domain* (Charpentier & Lalande), *Messiah* with Elmer Iseler Singers, Bach's *Magnificat* with Thirteen Strings, and the premiere of Ian Cusson's song cycle *Le Récital des Anges* (poetry by Emile Nelligan) at COC's noon hour concerts.

Marjorie has appeared as a guest soloist with Les Boréades de Montréal, with Windsor Symphony, Boise Philharmonic, Regina Symphony Orchestra, Montréal's Orchestre Metropolitain, Milwaukee Symphony Orchestra, and Edinburgh International Festival.

Marjorie appeared with Pacific Opera Victoria as Mercedes in *Carmen* and is a frequent guest artist with Toronto's *Voicebox: Opera in Concert*, most recently singing Erika in *Vanessa*.



JACOB ABRAHAMSE, TENOR

In the 2023/2024 season, Jacob Abrahamse performed Alfredo in Verdi's *La Traviata* (Brott Opera). He was also the tenor soloist in the Toronto Mendelssohn Choir's presentation of Bach's *Mass in B Minor* at Koerner Hall. This season, Abrahamse joins the Santa Fe Opera as an Apprentice Singer, an internationally recognized program that is one of the finest of its kind. In concert, Abrahamse will

perform as the tenor soloist in two performances of G.F. Handel's *Messiah*. First, with choir and orchestra at St. James Cathedral. Second, with the Toronto Symphony Orchestra in a benefit concert

for United Way. Abrahamse will also perform as the tenor soloist in W.A. Mozart's *Requiem* with the Toronto Beach Chorale and Orchestra. He will reprise this oratorio with the Mississauga Chamber Singers and Orchestra.

Abrahamse debuted at Roy Thomson Hall as a tenor soloist with the Toronto Symphony Orchestra and the Toronto Mendelssohn Choir in Felix Mendelssohn's Elijah. He also made his operatic debut by creating the starring role of the Holy Child in the Dora-award-winning premiere of R. Murray Schafer's opera, The Children's Crusade.



DION MAZEROLLE, BARITONE

Acadian baritone Dion Mazerolle has forged a solid reputation in Canada and Europe as an artist of the highest calibre. A former member of the Atelier lyrique de l'Opéra de Montréal, he is acclaimed for his musical finesse and strong stage presence, both in opera and in concert.

Dion has appeared as a soloist with many of Canada's premiere choirs and ensembles – *Carmina Burana* with the Guelph Chamber Choir, Haydn's *Creation* with Galileo Orchestre, and Bach's *Mass in B Minor* with Montreal's Ensemble Caprice. Upcoming performances include Brahms' *Requiem* with Orchestre Symphonique de l'Estuaire and Verdi's *Requiem* with Kindred Spirits Orchestra.

Dion made his debut as Golaud in Debussy's *Pelléas et Mélisande*, at the Teatri di Piacenza in Italy and debuted as le Roi de Trèfle in Prokofiev's surreal opera *L'Amour des Trois Oranges* with Opera National de Lorraine in Nancy, France. Critics hailed him as "dramatically and vocally outstanding" as Alberich in Wagner's *Das Rheingold* with Edmonton Opera.



THOMAS BELL, CONDUCTOR

Thomas Bell is a church musician, composer, and teacher.

His early musical education was as a boy chorister at Salisbury Cathedral, England, where in addition to singing for the daily choral services he played the flute, violin, and piano. His subsequent musical studies at Durham University, were augmented by flute lessons with two teachers: Patricia Morris (BBC Sym-

phony) and David Haslam (Northern Sinfonia of England). Tom then taught music at several schools in Oxford and London, including New College Choir School and the Dragon School, Oxford.

Tom later immigrated to Toronto, Canada, where together with Susan, they have lived and worked and raised their family for over thirty years. Tom directed the 150-voice Mississauga Children's Choir for sixteen years, winning many competitions including the *CBC Choral Competition* (children's choirs category), and touring across Canada and abroad. He also taught class music at the Toronto French School for nearly thirty years.

His compositions are published by Oxford University Press, Boosey & Hawkes, Alliance, Hinshaw, and others. Thomas is presently Director of Music and Organist at Trinity College, University of Toronto, and at St. James Cathedral, Toronto.
