Welcome to St. James Cathedral

This sacred land is the territory of several Indigenous Nations - the Wendat, the Haudenosaunee, and the Anishnaabe, and the Métis peoples, with special recognition to the Mississaugas of New Credit. This territory is governed by the Dish With One Spoon Wampum Belt Treaty, an agreement between the Haudenosaunee Confederacy and the Anishnaabe Confederacy to peaceably share and sustain the life of the Great Lakes. In the spirit of that Treaty we seek to place at the centre of our gatherings the values of respectful reciprocity, diversity, peace, responsibility, and mutual aid.

In the context of Christian Liturgy, Israel does not refer to the current political state, but either to the historic Hebrews of the ancient Near East or, in Christian theology, to all people who put their faith and trust in Jesus Christ.

OUR PREACHER TODAY

The Very Reverend Dr. David Monteith is the Dean of Canterbury Cathedral, appointed in December 2022. He studied zoology at Durham University and later trained for ministry at St John's College, Nottingham. Ordained in 1993, he served in parishes across Birmingham, London, and Wimbledon before becoming Canon Chancellor at Leicester Cathedral in 2009 and then Dean of Leicester in 2013. There, he led significant initiatives, including the reburial of King Richard III and a major redevelopment project. His appointment as Dean of Canterbury Cathedral was one of the final church roles approved by Queen Elizabeth II before her death. Monteith is known for his inclusive leadership and deep commitment to justice.



THE PROCLAMATION OF THE WORD

The First Reading

Acts 16:9-15

Reader

During the night Paul had a vision: there stood a man of Macedonia pleading with him and saying, 'Come over to Macedonia and help us.' When he had seen the vision, we immediately tried to cross over to Macedonia, being convinced that God had called us to proclaim the good news to them.

We set sail from Troas and took a straight course to Samothrace, the following day to Neapolis, and from there to Philippi, which is a leading city of the district of Macedonia and a Roman colony. We remained in this city for some days. On the sabbath day we went outside the gate by the river, where we supposed there was a place of prayer; and we sat down and spoke to the women who had gathered there. A certain woman named Lydia, a worshipper of God, was listening to us; she was from the city of Thyatira and a dealer in purple cloth. The Lord opened her heart to listen eagerly to what was said by Paul. When she and her household were baptized, she urged us, saying, 'If you have judged me to be faithful to the Lord, come and stay at my home.' And she prevailed upon us.
