Welcome to St. James Cathedral

This sacred land is the territory of several Indigenous Nations - the Wendat, the Haudenosaunee, and the Anishnaabe, and the Métis peoples, with special recognition to the Mississaugas of New Credit. We also acknowledge that we are on the shores of Niigaani-gichigami/Lake Ontario. This territory is governed by the Dish With One Spoon Wampum Belt Treaty, an agreement between the Haudenosaunee Confederacy and the Anishnaabe Confederacy to peaceably share and sustain the life of the Great Lakes. In the spirit of that Treaty we seek to place at the centre of our gatherings the values of respectful reciprocity, diversity, peace, responsibility, and mutual aid.

Liturgical Note:

In the context of Christian Liturgy, Israel does not refer to the current political state, but either to the historic Hebrews of the ancient Near East or, in Christian theology, to all people who put their faith and trust in Jesus Christ.

The First Reading

Job 3:1-4, 5:17-27, 6:1-4

Reader A reading from the Book of Job.

Afterward, Job spoke up and cursed the day he was born. Job said: Perish the day I was born, the night someone said, "A boy has been conceived." That day—let it be darkness; may God above ignore it, and light not shine on it.

Look, happy is the person whom God corrects; so don't reject the Almighty's instruction. He injures, but he binds up; he strikes, but his hands heal. From six adversities he will deliver you; from seven harm won't touch you. In famine he will ransom you from death; in war, from the power of the sword. You will be hidden from the tongue's sting, and you won't fear destruction when it comes. You will laugh at destruction and hunger; you won't be afraid of wild beasts; for you will make an agreement with the stones of the field; and the beasts of the field will be at peace with you. You will know that your tent is secure. You will examine your home and miss nothing. You will know that you'll have many children. Your offspring will be like the grass of the earth. You will come to your grave in old age as bundles of grain stacked up at harvesttime. Look, we've searched this out, and so it is; listen and find out for yourself.

Reader There was a Pharisee named Nicodemus, a Jewish leader. He came to Jesus at night and said to him, “Rabbi, we know that you are a teacher who has come from God, for no one could do these miraculous signs that you do unless God is with him.”

Jesus answered, “I assure you, unless someone is born anew, it’s not possible to see God’s kingdom.”

Nicodemus asked, “How is it possible for an adult to be born? It’s impossible to enter the mother’s womb for a second time and be born, isn’t it?”

Jesus answered, “I assure you, unless someone is born of water and the Spirit, it’s not possible to enter God’s kingdom. Whatever is born of the flesh is flesh, and whatever is born of the Spirit is spirit. Don’t be surprised that I said to you, ‘You must be born anew.’ God’s Spirit blows wherever it wishes. You hear its sound, but you don’t know where it comes from or where it is going. It’s the same with everyone who is born of the Spirit.”

Nicodemus said, “How are these things possible?”

“Jesus answered, “You are a teacher of Israel and you don’t know these things? I assure you that we speak about what we know and testify about what we have seen, but you don’t receive our testimony. If I have told you about earthly things and you don’t believe, how will you believe if I tell you about heavenly things? No one has gone up to heaven except the one who came down from heaven, the Human One. Just as Moses lifted up the snake in the wilderness, so must the Human One be lifted up so that everyone who believes in him will have eternal life. God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him won’t perish but will have eternal life. God didn’t send his Son into the world to judge the world, but that the world might be saved through him.





Questions for Week 2: "When Friends Fail, and God Is Silent" (Job 3–14)

Reading for the Sunday - Job 3:1-4, 5:17-27, 6:1-4

1. Job curses the day of his birth and questions the purpose of his life. What does Job's lament reveal about the place of honesty, pain, and protest in faith?
2. Job's friends believe suffering must be the result of sin or wrongdoing. Where do we still see this kind of thinking today?
3. Job's friends were most helpful when they sat in silence. Why is presence sometimes better than words?
4. What does this part of Job's story teach us about how to be faithful friends to those who are suffering?


