Welcome to St. James Cathedral

This sacred land is the territory of several Indigenous Nations - the Wendat, the Haudenosaunee, and the Anishnaabe, and the Métis peoples, with special recognition to the Mississaugas of New Credit. We also acknowledge that we are on the shores of Niigaani-gichigami/Lake Ontario. This territory is governed by the Dish With One Spoon Wampum Belt Treaty, an agreement between the Haudenosaunee Confederacy and the Anishnaabe Confederacy to peaceably share and sustain the life of the Great Lakes. In the spirit of that Treaty we seek to place at the centre of our gatherings the values of respectful reciprocity, diversity, peace, responsibility, and mutual aid.

Liturgical Note:

In the context of Christian Liturgy, Israel does not refer to the current political state, but either to the historic Hebrews of the ancient Near East or, in Christian theology, to all people who put their faith and trust in Jesus Christ.

Now, as we begin Holy Week, we tell the story of how Jesus entered Jerusalem in triumph, welcomed with palms and shouts of praise. Today we greet him as our King.

Yet this is not the end. Though the way is painful, we will follow our King from the glory of the palms to the glory of the resurrection.

God of our salvation, as we are united with Christ in his suffering, may we also share in his resurrection. Help us enter with joy into the celebration of the mighty acts by which you give us eternal life; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Reader This is the Good News of our Lord Jesus Christ as told by Matthew.

People **Glory to you, Lord Jesus Christ.**

Reader When they approached Jerusalem and came to Bethphage on the Mount of Olives, Jesus gave two disciples a task. He said to them, "Go into the village over there. As soon as you enter, you will find a donkey tied up and a colt with it. Untie them and bring them to me. If anyone says anything to you, say that their master needs them." He sent them off right away. Now this happened to fulfill what the prophet said, Say to Daughter Zion, "Look, your king is coming to you, humble and riding on a donkey, and on a colt the donkey's offspring." The disciples went and did just as Jesus had ordered them. They brought the donkey and the colt and laid their clothes on them. Then he sat on them.

Now a large crowd spread their clothes on the road. Others cut palm branches off the trees and spread them on the road. The crowds in front of him and behind him shouted, "Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessings on the one who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest!" And when Jesus entered Jerusalem, the whole city was stirred up. "Who is this?" they asked. The crowds answered, "It's the prophet Jesus from Nazareth in Galilee."

This is my Blood of the new covenant; it is poured out for you, and for all, that sins may be forgiven. Do this in remembrance of me."

So, as we do what he told us, we open our hearts to him; we remember how he died and rose again to live now in us.

Together with him we offer you these gifts: in them we give you ourselves.

Send your Holy Spirit on us and on this bread and this wine, that they may be the Body and Blood of Christ, and that, sharing your life, we may travel in your company to our journey's end.

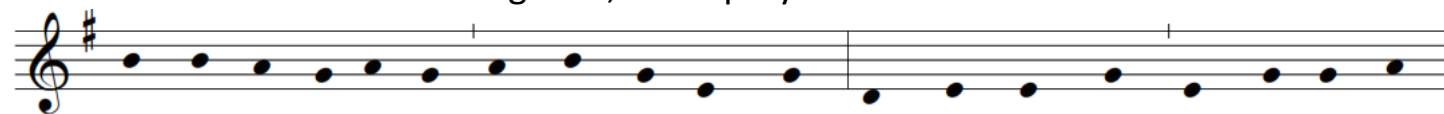

March 29 – April 5: Holy Week • An Invitation from Vicar Stephen Fields



Holy Week is the most sacred week in the Christian calendar. During these days, Christians remember and enter deeply into the central mystery of our faith: the suffering, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. It is a time when the Church slows down to pray, reflect, and walk with Christ through the final events of his earthly life. In doing so, Christians are reminded that through the cross, God's love confronts suffering, injustice, and death, and that through the resurrection, new life and hope are made possible. At the Cathedral, we are keeping this holy time through prayerful and reflective worship.

On Monday and Tuesday at 6:00pm, we will pray the Stations of the Cross, with a reading of "Lent" by Mary Druce, which will also be heard during the Maundy Thursday Vigil.

On Wednesday at 6:00pm, we gather for TeneBrass, a moving Service of Shadows with brass music. The week culminates in the sacred Triduum: Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday leading into Easter, when the Church proclaims the victory of Christ's love over death. 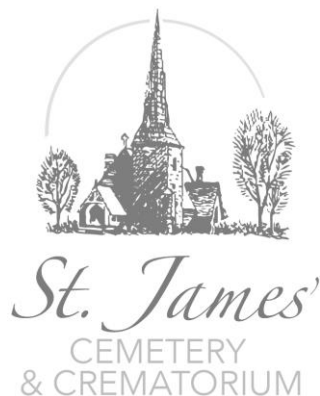
